









The Caritas Volunteer Leadership Program

The Caritas Volunteer Leadership Program

In contemporary society, mothers who are family caregivers living in subdivided flats face significant challenges. Through the Caritas Volunteer Leadership Program, students, guided by social worker mentors, learned a professional volunteer leadership curriculum. They identified the needs of grassroots parents and organized activities to foster effective communication between low-income mothers and their children, helping to alleviate mutual pressure.

This year, I pushed beyond my limits and organized an activity called "Mom's Respite

Space." During the preparatory phase, I had to coordinate manpower, funding, and time, which was challenging as a first-time volunteer.

Through community observation, we noticed that family caregivers often lose personal space due to the demands of caring for children, leading to communication problems between parents and kids. To address this, we organized our activity. Children learned to cook, emphasizing the importance of sharing household responsibilities, while mothers engaged in relaxing activities like making hand cream. We also created a presentation to share effective parent-child communication skills.




